



Thanksgiving Turkey Cookies

INGREDIENTS

- 1 roll Pillsbury refrigerated sugar cookies
- 1 container chocolate cream frosting
- -Candy corn
- Orange decorating icing
- -Mini candy-coated chocolate baking bits STEPS
- 1) Bake cookies as directed on roll or package. Cool for 10 min.
- Pipe chocolate frosting onto outer edge of cookie. Arrange candy corn over frosting for feathers
- 3) Pipe orange icing onto each cookie to resemble turkey face and feet. Use orange icing to attach baking bits to turkey face for eyes. Pipe black gel on baking bits for centers of eyes.
