NDA Class of 2014 Honored at Academic Signing

On Wednesday, May 14, 2014, Notre Dame Academy held an Academic Signing in honor of the Class of 2014 for their outstanding academic achievements. NDA's Class of 2014 earned \$16 million in scholarship offers. Each of the students signing at the event is receiving at least half the cost of tuition through scholarships and grants at the institution she plans to attend. NDA Community Sharing in Common Reader Experience

This summer everyone in the Notre Dame Academy community has a summer reading assignment: *I Am Malala* by Malala Yousafzai. The story is that of young Malala Yousafzai, who spoke out when the Taliban took control of the Swat Valley in Pakistan. Malala refused to be silenced and fought for her right to an education. In retaliation, the Taliban sought to kill her. On October 9, 2012, a Taliban fighter boarded her school bus, asked "Who is Malala?" and shot her in the head at point-blank range. Few expected her to survive. Malala's miraculous recovery has made her a global symbol of peaceful protest and, at the age of sixteen, the youngest nominee ever for the Nobel Peace Prize.

While this is a required reading assignment for NDA students, faculty and staff, everyone in the NDA community is invited to share in this common reader experience. Many events and discussions will take place in the fall to illuminate concepts in the book.

"The choice of this common reader fully supports NDA's mission to educate young women to make a difference in the world," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "This shared experience will encourage critical and global thinking at NDA, and we welcome alumnae to participate in our common reader program."

Science Research Students Win Gold at International Genius Olympiad



Two of NDA's Science Research students recently won gold medals at the International Genius Olympiad. Ellen Kendall and Cassidy Ryan, rising seniors at Notre Dame Academy, participated in the International Genius Olympiad in Oswego, NY, from June 15 to 19. Students from over 50 counties competed at the event. Out of 502 science submissions, Ellen and Cassidy were among only 20 students achieving gold medal status. Ellen's project demonstrated the potential of sodium alginate beads to remove copper contamination from water and then use solar-powered electrolysis to reclaim copper from the beads. Cassidy studied the effect of two pharmaceuticals, now showing a measurable presence in waterways, on the bioindicator organisms daphnia (water fleas) and planaria (flatworms).



NDA Principal Dr. Laura Koehl Named President of Notre Dame Academy

The Sisters of Notre Dame and the Board of Directors of Notre Dame Academy appointed Dr. Laura Koehl, Ed.D. as President of Notre Dame Academy, effective July 1, 2014. Dr. Koehl is the third NDA graduate to serve as president of the high school and the first lay person to hold the position. She replaces Sister Mary Lynette Shelton, whose three-year term ended in June. Dr. Koehl has been principal at Notre Dame since 2010.

The Board of Directors formed a committee in January to confirm the president/principal model currently used at Notre Dame Academy. In March, it formed a Presidential Search Committee, which recommended Dr. Koehl.

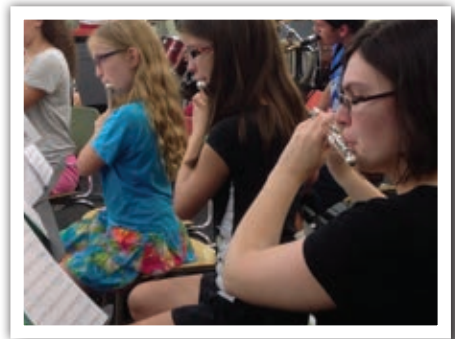
Prior to her role as principal, Dr. Koehl was a member of the school faculty. She is a 1975 graduate of Notre Dame Academy and has 30 years of educational experience including 25 years in Catholic education. She serves on Notre Dame Academy's National Education Office Advisory Board, the Notre Dame Urban Education Center Board of Directors, and the Thomas More College MAT (Masters of Arts in Teaching) Advisory Board.

Dr. Koehl, committed to the mission of the Sisters of Notre Dame to proclaim God's goodness and provident care, will bring her gifts and experience to serve wholeheartedly the community of Notre Dame Academy to educate young women to make a difference in the world.

A search committee to replace Dr. Koehl as principal will begin in the fall. An Interim assistant principal will join the school administration team for the 2014-15 school year.

Spring Sports Update...

The Spring Sports Awards Program was held on Monday, June 2. The bass fishing won the team G.P.A award with an outstanding 3.652 average. The remaining four teams all accumulative team averages of 3.367 or higher.

The bass fishing team made history by becoming the first NDA team to compete in the regional tournament. The two Panda teams participated at Her-rington Lake and, out of 66 boats, finished in 21st and 26th place.

The softball team graduated 6 outstanding teammates (pictured above), whose talents assisted in leading their team to a second consecutive regional final. The team set 11 new school records including Team Total Hits (343), RBI's (248), Batting Average (.394). Laura Finke added 6 more in the categories of Total Hits Season (60), Career (206), Runs-Season (51) Career Runs (196), Career Batting Average (.433), and Career Stolen Bases (120). Maria Schaefer added her name to the board with Career RBI's (112), as did Abby Jones with a Season ERA (0.74). Congratulations to all of our softball seniors!

The tennis team won their 19th consecutive regional title. Lacrosse and track and field had quality seasons as well. Good job to all the spring teams on a well done season!

NDA Says Goodbye and Thank You to Kim Gunning



After 25 years at Notre Dame Academy, Kim Gunning has decided to step down from her position as Athletic Director to pursue other dreams. "It's the right time for me to move on," says Gunning. "I've achieved everything I hoped to achieve during my 25 years at NDA, and I'm ready for a change."

The list of Gunning's achievements at NDA is long and quite impressive. As volleyball coach at NDA for over a decade, Gunning led the NDA team to state titles in 1989, 1991, and 1994 and runner-up finishes in 1990, 1996, 1998, and 2000. She has also built NDA's athletic program into one of the most competitive and respected in the area. During her time at NDA, almost every sport offered at NDA has seen success at the regional level and some had state success as well.

During Gunning's tenure, NDA has added four sports programs: lacrosse, bowling, bass fishing and archery, giving the school 13 varsity sports. NDA also completed its extraordinary Buenger Sports Complex under the direction of Gunning.

"Although we are sorry to see Ms. Gunning leave Notre Dame Academy, we support her decision to move on," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "We are grateful for all that Ms. Gunning has accomplished during her 25 years at NDA. We celebrate her tenure and wish Ms. Gunning well."

Meet NDA's New Athletic Director...

Notre Dame Academy welcomes Myanna Webster as its new Athletic Director. For the past two years, Webster has served as a volleyball skills coach. "Myanna comes to NDA with a proven background in athletics," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl. "She is ready to continue the rich tradition of success in girls' high school sports at NDA."

In addition to serving as an assistant coach for the USA Youth National Team in 2012, the former Bearcat served as Assistant Coach for the University of Cincinnati Women's Volleyball team for five years. During her tenure, UC Women's Volleyball won the 2011 Big East Tournament Championship, Big East Regular Season Champs in 2010 and 2008, and participated in the NCAA tournament in 2011, 2010, 2009, 2008. As a UC Women's Volleyball coach, Webster also played a part in training a number of AVCA All Americans, AVCA Regional Performers, Big East All Conference Performers, Big East Rookie of the Year, and Big East Player of the Year.

Originally from Austin, Texas, Webster earned her master's degree in mental health counseling in 2013 from the University of Cincinnati. In addition, Webster holds a bachelor's of interdisciplinary studies in Human Ecology from the University of Cincinnati, where she earned many honors playing for the Women's Volleyball Team and serving as team co-captain for two years. As a player, Webster was a two-time all-conference selection, the 2003 Conference USA Freshman of the Year, and one of the top middle blockers in UC program history.

Webster and her husband, Matthew, live in Lakeside Park, Kentucky.

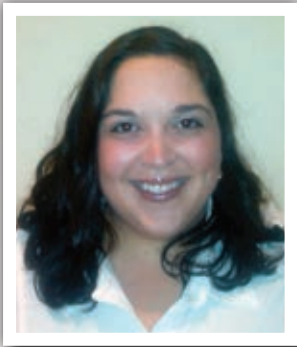

NDA Fall Fundraiser Chairs Pull Out All the Stops For Fall Event

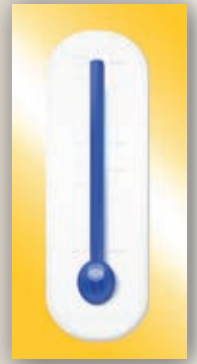
