Dedication Celebration

October 28, 2018, was a joyous day of celebration at Notre Dame Academy! Students, faculty, staff, alumnae, benefactors, and civic and religious leaders gathered for a Dedication Celebration to commemorate NDA's *Excellence Without Boundaries* Capital Campaign renovations. The day began with a formal ceremony where Most Reverend Roger J. Foys, D.D. blessed the completed new spaces on NDA's campus and the Northern Kentucky Chamber of Commerce took part in a ceremonial ribbon cutting.

It was a momentous occasion for the NDA community. Through the *Excellence Without Boundaries* Capital Campaign, Notre Dame Academy's 20th century building has been transformed into a 21st century optimum educational environment for NDA students to learn and thrive. Notre Dame Academy was proud to share the completion of the \$7 million renovation project, offering student-guided tours following the formal ceremony. NDA's newly expanded Mary, Mother of the World Chapel is scheduled to be completed in the spring and a special Chapel Blessing Ceremony will be held in March of 2019.

As a school sponsored by the Sisters of Notre Dame for the past 113 years, Notre Dame Academy has been an educational leader in innovation and best practice in the competitive environment of education. NDA has led the way in educational technology, integrating core competencies that enable students to thrive in the 21st century. As the only all-female college preparatory school in Northern Kentucky and the Diocese of Covington, Notre Dame Academy is proud of its Catholic identity and reputation as one of the area's leading educational institutions.

In addressing guests of the Dedication Celebration, Sisters of Notre Dame Provincial Sr. Mary Ethel Parrott said,

"Today we celebrate an educational facility that is truly transformed for the 21st century. We celebrate that girls can learn any number of new languages, including coding and robotics. They can do so in this new space where the human spirit can find creative expression, in an environment that likewise values functionality and promotes self-discipline. We celebrate today what we have accomplished together, what God's goodness has done in all of us. We celebrate that, in many different ways – not the least through the efforts of Dr. Koehl, Mr. VonHandorf, our fundraising leadership and advancement staff – we celebrate that all of us have brought near completion this learning space. It remains a place where girls can be transformed into young women, who in turn can inspire transformation and make a difference wherever they may go."

Women Making A Difference

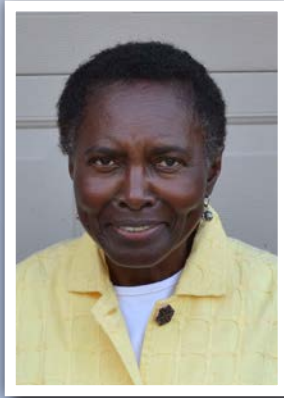

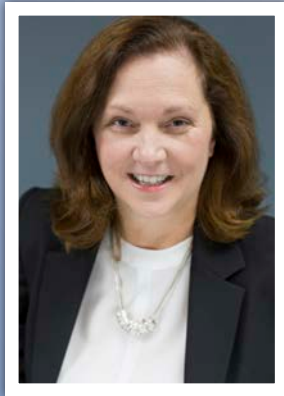

Rosa Hollis-Bird



Rosa Hollis-Bird '62 is a true example of a woman making a difference. Rosa was raised in Covington, Kentucky and enrolled in Notre Dame Academy in 1959, at that time being one of only two African American students in the school. After her graduation from NDA, Rosa entered the Jewish Hospital School of Nursing and received her LPN, and later went on to receive her R.N. degree. Rosa joined the United States Air Force as a Captain, went through basic training, and was deployed to several stateside bases. However, because of her desire to serve in the Public Health arena, Rosa transferred to the United States Army, where she was employed at Walter Reed Hospital. She eventually retired from the Army as a Lieutenant Colonel. Rosa has filled her retirement years with tireless dedication and service- service to her parish, the Cathedral Basilica, the many residents of Rosedale Green, at which her mother is a resident, Our Savior Parish, her beloved classmates, and her family. Because of Rosa's selfless and lifelong dedication to others, she continues to touch the lives of many and make a difference in the world around her.

Karen Bieger Finan



Karen Bieger Finan '77 is a faith-filled woman, deeply committed to the mission of Notre Dame Academy and the Sisters. Karen serves as the perfect example of a professional woman who places family first, while at the same time, is committed to her community and profession. Notre Dame Academy Scholarship Recipient Receives Diploma 75 Years Later

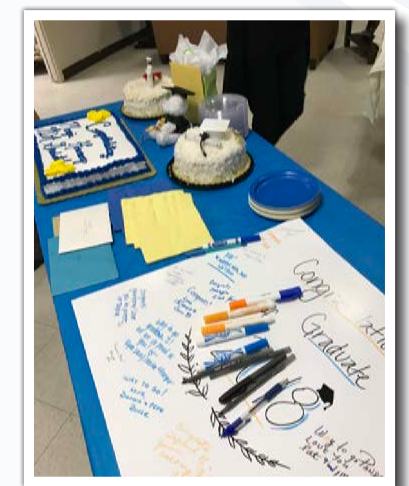
Although Margaret Ann Koeninger was offered a four-year scholarship to Notre Dame Academy in 1943, she was unable to take advantage of the opportunity to complete her NDA education or receive a high school diploma until recently. On September 10, Notre Dame Academy President Dr. Laura Koehl and Principal Mr. Jack VonHandorf made a surprise presentation of an honorary NDA diploma to Margaret Ann (Koeninger) Zink-Fritsch at Rose-dale Green Senior Care facility.

Upon graduating from St. Stephens Catholic Grade School in 1943, Margie was excited to be offered a four-year scholarship to Notre Dame Academy. She attended NDA for a short time; however the family could not afford Margie's transportation. In those days, it would have cost a nickel to ride the crosstown bus from Newport to NDA but Margie's father was laid off from work and regrettably she was unable to continue to attend NDA or receive her high school diploma.

At age 15, Margie accepted a position at Wadsworth Electric in Covington as the secretary to the purchasing department president. Being the eldest of eight children, she was also expected (and relied upon) to help out at home. Any wages earned from Wadsworth were welcomed by her parents. She worked there for seven years.

Margie later married and became the mother of 12 children. After a lifetime of focusing on her family and dedicating herself to serving others in her community, Margie had lived with the disappointment of not earning and receiving a high school diploma. When the Sisters of Notre Dame and Notre Dame Academy heard of Margie's frustration, a resolution was created and approved to award Margie with an honorary diploma.

"Like many NDA graduates, Margie has spent her life as a servant leader dedicating herself to family, church and community. Margie is a woman who has made an impactful difference in the world and we are proud to have her join our 10,000 plus alumnae around the world," said NDA President Dr. Laura Koehl.

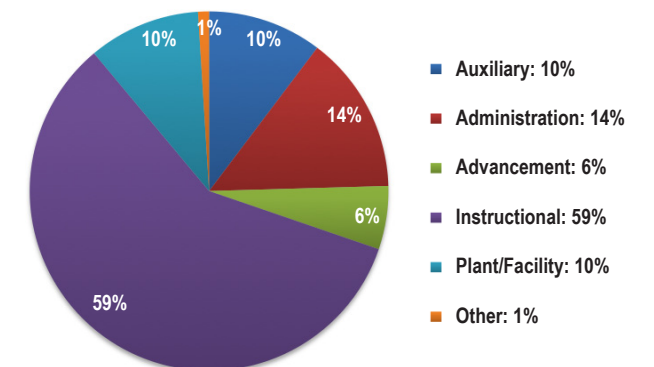

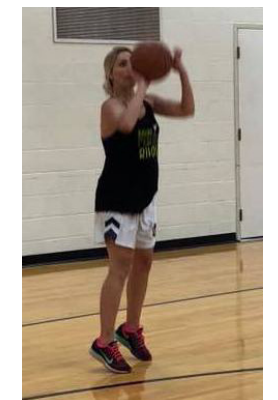

- Everyone will gather for a 30 minute Pep Rally in the gym after 4th period/lunch (approximatley 12:50 p.m.).

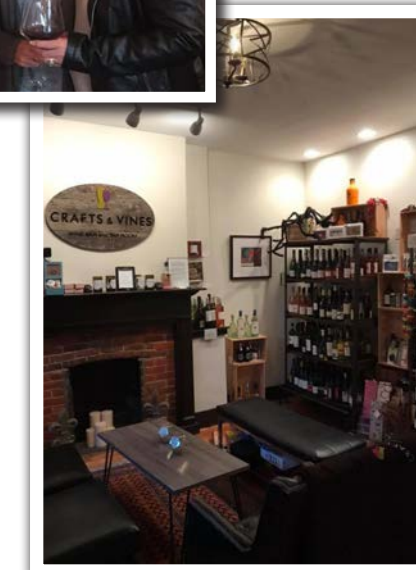

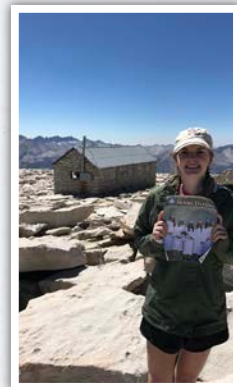
