The first round of the search process yielded three viable candidates with a broad range of experiences and expertise; however, after thoughtful consideration and deliberation by the Presidential Search Committee, this initial phase did not result in the selection of a new president. 

UPCOMING DANCES

By the end of this week, almost all grade levels will have attended their second quarter Admin meeting where dress code expectations for the dances were discussed. See handbook excerpts below followed by a brief summary of expectations. When in doubt, students are encouraged to show Mrs. Grayson the dress (a picture or in person), so she can find out in advance if the dress is appropriate for NDA's dance.



ATTENTION SENIORS

HANDBOOK HIGHLIGHTS

Dances p. 18

Dances that are held at Notre Dame and Covington Catholic are school-sponsored events and drug free. Appropriate dress, behavior and dancing are expected. Random breathalyzer tests and purse searches may occur. Students who do not follow the rules will be asked to leave after the parents have been notified and rides will be arranged if necessary.

Special Occasions p. 24

Students sometimes have the opportunity to dress up for events such as Silver Bells, Junior/Senior Prom, Mother/Daughter and Father/Daughter dances, special senior events, and theatrical performances. At these times it is expected that students dress in a way that is acceptable for young women attending a Catholic high school. This includes appropriate dress or skirt length and coverage of the stomach, back, and chest areas.

In Summary, dance attire must:

- Provide proper coverage of the chest area (no cleavage or plunging necklines). Modesty panels could be added to a dress to address this issue.
- Strapless and spaghetti strap dresses are acceptable as long as they meet other dress code expectations.
- Be long enough. The length of the dress should extend below one's fingertips when arms are fully extended at sides. This applies to the shortest hem of the dress (consider an asymmetrical dress).
- An open back is acceptable; however, the open back must not extend below the lower curvature of one's back.
- Cover stomach and midriff areas. Cut-outs are not approved. A mesh layer or material could be added to the dress to cover the exposed areas.
- Mask requirement is TBD, and this will be decided as we near the event's date.



2023 Synod on Synodality: The Church Wants to Hear From You!

Pope Francis has called for a worldwide discussion leading up to the next meeting of the Synod of Bishops in 2023 on the topic of SYNODALITY. Synodality is “journeying together” - a way of living out our faith that involves shared responsibility, open and honest dialogue, and discernment with the Holy Spirit in addressing the issues facing our Church today. It is speaking and listening to one another and the Holy Spirit. In what ways does our parish journey together? How well do we do it? Are there people or groups that have been left behind on the journey? How can we speak and listen to them? Parishes, institutions, individuals, and small groups across the diocese will have the opportunity to reflect and respond to these and other questions over the next several months. All are invited and encouraged to participate. Input will be compiled and forwarded on to the national and then international levels to help the Bishops prepare for the 2023 Synod in Rome. GSA has been approved for \$2,850,000 from the American Recovery Plan (ARP). This funding will allow GSA to welcome approximately 500 students - for each of the next three summers into the arts immersion program! Alumni of the program are eligible for scholarships at nearly 30 colleges and universities. A total of 93% of the GSA 2021 class said they felt more prepared to attend college because of their GSA experience.
