EXPECTATION REVIEW

Over the past week, Mr. VonHandorf and Mrs. Timmerding have reviewed expectations with all students. These expectations will ensure their success and set them up for the workforce where guidelines and expectations must continue to be followed. A few important reminders for the students were:

- There is to be no food / drink (other than water) in any part of the building, other than the cafeteria.
- Shoes must have backs on them. Crocs are permitted provided they are in sports mode.
 - · Water bottles must be non-glass, closed lid containers.
- If students are going to be late or are going to leave early please utilize the attendance email at attendance@ndapandas.org.
- Cell phones are permitted provided they are turned off and in students' backpacks from 8:00 a.m. 3:00 p.m.
- Uniform checks will occur this year, so it is important that students know those guidelines.
- Students are encouraged to be upstanders, to notice when someone might need help or encouragement, and to demonstrate the leadership qualities that the Sisters of Notre Dame embody.

PARKING LOT POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

To ensure the safety and well-being of our students and the children from St. Julie Learning Center, parents and students must understand the parking lot policies and procedures at Notre Dame Academy. Please review our parking lot policies and procedures below:

- 1. Please be cautious of students walking to and from the parking lot to the school entrance. Students should be crossing at crosswalks.
- 2. When picking up your daughter after school, please park in an empty num-



bered spot and advise your daughter to meet you at the car. There is also a row of spots at the front of the parking lot where parents can park in at the end of the day.

IMPORTANT NOTE: WHEN PARKING, PLEASE BACK INTO YOUR PARKING SPOT TO PROVIDE ADDED SAFETY TO OUR STUDENTS.

- 3. For safety purposes and as advised by the Park Hills Fire Department, it is important to keep the parking lot aisles and all fire lanes clear. **PLEASE DO NOT** line up for afternoon pick up in the aisles of the parking lot or in fire lanes. All cars picking up after school **MUST** be either parked in a spot or lined up on the Hilton Drive hill.
- 4. The back of our parking lot is shared with the Sisters of Notre Dame and Julie Learning Center. Signs have been installed and the spaces left unnumbered for the parking that is needed for the Sisters that live at St. Joseph Heights, their employees and the spaces needed for parents to pick up their children from Julie Learning Center. There is a shift change that takes place at 3:00 p.m. for the workers at the Heights. The Julie Learning Center has pickup that begins at approximately the same time as our dismissal.
- 5. Students who drive to school need to purchase a parking permit at a cost of \$25.00 for the year. All parked cars must show a parking permit for the current year. Students are to park on the main lot in the student parking area in their designated spot. A car parked on the lot without a permit or in a reserved area will result in a violation. A car parked in a fire lane is subject to police citation and may be towed at the owner's expense.
- 6. PLEASE SEE THE PICTURE ABOVE to see available parking for afternoon pick-up.

We will continue the staggered dismissal (implemented fall 2021) as well as traffic light support from Park Hills Police Department to help to ensure the safety of our students on the parking lot at the end of the day.



ATTENTION ALL NDA STUDENT ATHLETES

DISCOUNT CARD FUNDRAISER

All Parents of Athletes must make your selection for the Athletic Fundraiser option in Final Forms by Sept. 1, 2023.

Every Athlete at NDA must participate in the Athletic Fundraiser. This year the fundraiser is brand new and features a Plastic Discount Card. You get discounts to local merchants from a plastic credit card size card that fits conveniently in your wallet . The card contains discounts to approximately 20-24 local merchants and restaurants on the back of the card. These discounts can be used multiple times and are good for one year. Also included are 4-5 Key Tags that can fit on your keyring that contain discounts to restaurants or merchants that are single one-time use discounts. The discount cards are sold for \$20 each.



You have until Sept 1 to make your selection. You have 3 options available to choose from for your athlete's participation. (refer to chart below)

- · You can sell all 18 cards (Pay NO fundraiser fee)
- · You can opt in at half sell 9 cards (half the cards, but also pay half of the additional fundraiser fee of \$140)
- · Or opt OUT completely and sell NO cards, but pay a full fundraiser fee of \$280

Once you have made your selection in Final Forms, after September 1, 2023 and the cards have been produced for you, the cards are yours to sell and your responsibility.

If your daughter is unsure if she will participate in a sport (for instance in the spring) you may want to choose the "sell no cards" option. If she decides not to do a sport at all you will not be billed the fundraiser fee, as no cards were produced for you.

If NO SELECTION is made you will fall into the category of "Sell No Cards" and be billed the full \$280 fundraiser fee for participating in a sport.

- Discount Cards will be delivered to NDA and picked up by students in mid October.
- A spreadsheet of the card sales must be uploaded by the student to a provided link on our website (for tracking purposes)
- · All Money for the cards turned in to the Athletic Department by December 15, 2023

Discount Card Fundraiser Requirements

Select an option for each child participating in Athletics below *by September 1, 2023*.

If no option is selected, or a student chooses to participate in athletics after September 1, 2023, the student will owe the "Sell No Cards" cost.

If you are unsure whether your daughter plans to participate in athletics, you may want to select the "Sell No Cards" option so that cards are not produced for you and you are not held financially responsible for those printed cards.
