I would like to begin by offering my apologies for any inconvenience caused by the altered dismissal times today at NDA. I want to provide you with an explanation of the situation and assure you that the safety and well-being of our students remain our top priority. Earlier today, during ongoing construction work in our gymnasium, the sanding of the gymnasium floors produced dust that triggered our fire alarm system. As a safety precaution, all students were promptly and safely evacuated from the building. Once we established that the construction-related dust was indeed the cause of the alarm, and there was no actual fire or safety threat, we were able to safely return students to their classrooms where students resumed testing. We understand that this temporary disruption was an inconvenience, particularly given that today was Super Day at NDA, with our freshmen, sophomores and juniors taking standardized tests. I truly appreciate your patience and flexibility. Your understanding is invaluable to us as we navigate such situations to ensure the safety and security of our students.






YOU'RE INVITED
