

THE CASE FOR GIRLS' SCHOOLS

At Notre Dame Academy, it's all about girls! It has been since 1906, when the Sisters of Notre Dame first opened the doors to Notre Dame Academy. Although there was no research to support the value of an all-girls school a century ago, the sisters were keenly aware of the tremendous advantages. Today we have both extensive research and 118 years of experience to support the countless benefits of girls' schools.

All-girls' schools offer enormous value to their students, value that cannot be duplicated in other school settings. NDA students are empowered to transcend traditional stereotypical roles and they quickly become fearless, curious, and enthusiastic in their learning. At NDA girls are the first ones to raise their hands in class, they are the leaders of the school, and those planning Masses and service projects. Every science research student, academic team captain, writer, singer, artist, and athlete is a girl. They are more comfortable being themselves and take pride in who they are as students and young women. At Notre Dame Academy, our students are uniquely prepared to manage leadership positions in society.

Recent research by the National Coalition of Girls' Schools (NCGS) shows unequivocal support for the value of an all-girls educational environment. In particular, students at all-girls schools report:

- Having higher aspirations and greater motivation
- Being challenged to achieve more
- Engaging more actively in the learning process
- · Participating in activities that prepare them for the world outside of school
- · Feeling more comfortable being themselves and expressing their ideas
- Showing greater gains on core academic and life skills
- Being and feeling more supported in their endeavors

In another national study commissioned by the NCGS, the statistically significant edge girls' school graduates have over their coed peers is clear. The report also notes that girls benefit from a single-gender education in the following ways:

- Greater academic engagement
- Higher SAT scores
- Greater interest in graduate school
- Higher academic self-confidence
- Greater interest in engineering careers
- Greater political engagement

The voices of young women are not silenced in the educational environment of an all-girls' school. There is no reason for concern about teachers calling on boys more often than girls. At an all-girls' school, young women learn self-confidence and leadership skills, and they excel in the areas of reading, writing, mathematics and science.

At Notre Dame Academy, we strongly believe in the advantages of a single-gender learning environment for young women. While research supports our convictions, we have over 10,000 other reasons for our way of thinking - our graduates. NDA graduates are poised, confident, and prepared for a life of service to others centered in the Catholic faith. They are empowered, loving, and intellectually competent women committed to using their God given gifts to make a difference in the world.

At Notre Dame Academy, we're always striving to grow, learn and embrace new ideas that enhance our students' experience. One of the most exciting innovations in recent years is the Family System, which was introduced two years ago and has quickly become a core part of life at NDA.

The Family System is all about building connections, fostering leadership, and strengthening the unique sisterhood that makes NDA so special. It's designed to help students bond across grade levels, giving everyone the chance to meet and connect with peers they might not otherwise interact with.

NDA's four families are each proudly represented by a patron saint and a color: St. Joan of Arc (blue), St. Hildegard of Bingen (purple), St. Gemma Galgani (green) and St. Rose of Lima (pink). Students have had a blast decorating the hallways in their family colors, showing off their family pride in creative and colorful ways. Each family is made up of six homerooms, with students from all grade levels, and they meet twice a week to build relationships, collaborate, and work together as a team.

One of the most fun aspects of the Family System is the Family Competition that runs throughout the school year. Students can earn points for their family by excelling in academics (GPA), maintaining good attendance, participating in school events, serving the community, and more. At the end of the year, the family with the most points wins the Family Trophy and a visit from a coffee truck to celebrate their victory in style!

Our Pandas have embraced the Family System with open arms. It's not just about competition—it's about creating new friendships, feeling a sense of belonging, and building a supportive, family-like culture that makes NDA feel even more like home.

The Family System has truly become one of the highlights of NDA life, and we can't wait to see how it continues to bring our students closer together!

St. Rose of Lima- She is the patron saint of Latin America and the Philippines. She lived a life of simplicity and dedication to the poor and was known as a woman of integrity.

St. Hildegard of Bingen- She is the patron saint of writers and musicians and is one of only 4 female doctors of the Church. St. Hildegard was a renaissance woman who was involved in art, science, politics, and was the abbess of her convent.



When asked to describe a servant leader, one might hear phrases such as "one dedicated to the needs of others" or "someone who leads by example, not by mandate" or perhaps simply "someone who genuinely cares more for others than themselves." Robert K. Greenleaf coined the term servant-leadership in his groundbreaking 1970 essay, "The Servant as Leader."

Although this concept might have been a "groundbreaking theory" in the 1970s, it was merely the way of life for Sister Mary Agnetis as she took the reins of Notre Dame Academy in 1906. Seeing the value of every person, practicing the power of humility as a way of daily living, always listening with concern, trusting her students and faculty to do their best and showing through her words and actions the care and love she had for all she met, was simply the way Sr Mary Agnetis lived every single day during her 95 years on earth.

Born in 1879 as Anna Marie Schmitz, she was the 4th in a family which would eventually number 11 children. Her early childhood was spent in the neighborhood surrounding Philadelphia St. in Covington.

On February 2, 1897, at the age of 17, Anna entered the cloisters of the Sisters of Notre Dame. Later that year, on August 30, she took her holy vows as a novice and took the name Sr. Mary Agnetis. Two and one-half years later, Sr. Mary Agnetis pledged her life to God on January 3, 1900, as she pronounced her first vows as a Sister of Notre Dame.

In 1906, Sr. Agnetis was given the task of starting a high school, to reach beyond grade school and continue the educational opportunities for young ladies. This "task" would define the life of Sr. Agnetis from that point forward and would start her journey as a true servant leader for all of the young women whose lives she touched. Appointed as Instructor and Directress, Sr. Agnetis began with 6 students in the fall of 1906 and built an educational leadership legacy spanning 68 years and beyond. "From the moment Sr. Mary Agnetis started the high school, she became part of the soul of the academy, so dedicated to its growth materially, spiritually and academically, that she grew to become the personification of Notre Dame Academy. Every student who attended NDA from 1906 until well into the 1960s has gone away with a part of Sister's personality, for these - the ideal of the Virgin Mary, the spirituality of vigorously living the Mass, the culture of the classics and the refinement of true Christian womanly living – are as much a part of the academy curriculum as they are of Sr. Mary Agnetis's life." (KY Post, Jack Wessling, 1960). In 1920, Sister Mary Agnetis was officially appointed as principal of the high school. During the next few years, Sister combined her love for leading and teaching the NDA students with her thirst for personal knowledge and self-improvement, as she became a student herself once again, and received her BA from Xavier University in 1924.

By the early 1920s, under the leadership of Sr. Mary Agnetis, Notre Dame Academy High School had secured its place as the premier educational facility for young women, a legacy that continues to this day.

At the heart of Notre Dame Academy lies a commitment to nurturing the spiritual lives of our students, faculty, staff, and the wider NDA community. Through Campus Ministry, we offer countless opportunities for reflection, growth, and service, all centered on deepening our Catholic faith. In close partnership with the Religion Department, Campus Ministry enriches the NDA experience through liturgy, religious education, Christian service, and transformative retreat opportunities.

In the sacred space of our *Mary, Mother of the World Chapel*, students are invited to foster a deeper relationship with God, gathering for prayer services and Masses that unite our community in shared worship. For moments of quiet contemplation, the Reflection Space offers a serene environment for students to pray, meditate, and honor God in solitude.

Liturgical Activities

Our Catholic faith is woven into the fabric of life at Notre Dame Academy. Throughout the year, we gather as a community to celebrate the liturgy, uniting in worship to renew our spiritual commitments. In addition to school-wide liturgies, students and families come together periodically for family Masses in our school chapel, further strengthening the bonds of faith within our NDA community.

Prayer Opportunities

Prayer is the foundation upon which each day at NDA begins and ends. At the start of every school day and each class period, we pause to center ourselves in prayer, inviting God's presence into our daily lives. The NDA Chapel is open to students and faculty throughout the day, serving as a sanctuary for personal reflection or quiet prayer whenever time permits.

Mass is celebrated twice a week in our chapel, either before or after school, with weekly schedules shared with the student body. On non-Mass mornings, students are invited to gather at 7:45 a.m. for a decade of the rosary—an enriching way for many to start their day. Additionally, the Sacrament of Reconciliation is offered weekly during Panda Prime Time, and students have the opportunity to receive this sacrament twice a year with their religion classes. Adoration is also offered once a month during Panda Prime Time, providing further opportunities for spiritual reflection.

Academic Enhancement Classes

The program consists of four courses designed to reinforce material presented in other disciplines. Students in the program meet with their AEP teacher and earn credit for completion. They will identify individual learning styles and utilize time management, organizational, and selfadvocacy skills.

Panda Prime Time

PANDA PRIME TIME is a 30-minute period that occurs twice a week at NDA. During this time, students can meet with a teacher for extra help, work on homework, make up a test, collaborate on a group project, work with the intervention specialists, or talk to a counselor. This period provides students with the opportunity to address their academic, emotional, physical, and spiritual needs.

Admission Criteria

The Academic Enhancement Program (A.E.P.) is open to students with or without a diagnosed learning disability. Students may be recommended by either their parents or teachers.

Alternative Learning Plans

A student who has been diagnosed with a learning or health-related issue that impairs learning will work closely with our intervention specialists and counselors to create an educational plan that addresses any necessary accommodations.

Bridge Program

NDA offers a week-long Bridge Program in the summer, prior to the start of the school year, for freshmen. The Intervention Specialists and other teachers assist students by reviewing study skills, math, science, and summer reading.

At NDA, we have a strong academic tradition of empowering young women to make a difference in the world. Notre Dame Academy helps develop each student in an environment that fosters growth of the whole person. Our curriculum is designed to challenge the abilities of our students while captivating their interests and providing support where needed. The NDA community strives to instill in young women not only knowledge but also spiritual and moral values that will help them grow as women of faith, vision and purpose.

The goal of our academic program is to educate young women by cultivating their God given intellectual abilities in order for them to make a difference in our world. We believe in an education that combines the timeless wisdom of our Catholic faith with the necessary skills that our students will need to adapt to a continuously changing world. To that end, we offer a curriculum that will prepare each young woman for the many challenges that she will face in college and life. Our highly qualified teachers demand excellence in the classroom and encourage each student to work to her full potential. With an approach that integrates academics, service, arts and athletics, we are molding young women to have a vibrant faith and a passion for learning.

Curriculum

College and universities base their acceptance of students on how well the students perform in high school and their program of studies. Historically over 99% of Notre Dame Academy graduates go to college/university. The majority of our students attend 4-year colleges; however, students are also prepared for 2-year and vocational courses of study. The NDA curriculum is designed to prepare our students not only for a positive and successful college experience but for the total formation of our young women as well.

Courses are offered on three levels of difficulty: College Preparatory, Honors, and Advanced Placement/College Level (Dual Credit). Academic departments recommend a course level for the required classes that, in their professional judgment, is appropriate for each student. Students are encouraged to select elective courses according to their ability and interest. (Students may take courses in all levels based on their experience and interests.) College Preparatory level courses provide a solid educational foundation for higher education. A copy of Notre Dame Academy's Curriculum Guide can be found on our website at www.ndapandas.org.

Academic Opportunities

Students at Notre Dame Academy are offered many opportunities for academic enrichment. Multiple courses are offered at the Honors, Advanced Placement and College Level (Dual Credit). Honors level courses involve higher academic standards and a greater workload than College Preparatory courses. Advanced Placement (AP) or College Level (Dual Credit) courses provide the opportunity to earn college credit while remaining enrolled in high school. Students are invited by the respective department to be enrolled in these courses.

Historically NDA has been very strong in the disciplines of Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics, providing our students with a comprehensive curriculum that emphasizes critical thinking, creativity, innovation, and real-world problem solving. That tradition continues today at NDA with our 1:1 iPad Initiative and the development of our Instructional Technology Department.

Notre Dame Academy strives to be innovative and current in our educational efforts. This can be seen in the Accelerated Learning Opportunities at NDA as well as in the many courses added to our curriculum over the past five years that are relevant to today's learners.

Academic Counseling & Support Services

At Notre Dame Academy, we do our best to be sensitive to the needs of all students and we are committed to assist students who struggle at times in various areas of their high school experience. In order to provide academic, emotional, physical, social and career support to all of our students, Notre Dame Academy has a full-time Intervention Specialist, a part-time Intervention Specialists, four full-time Counselors and a full-time Records Coordinator.

Our highly qualified and dedicated counseling staff collaborates with faculty and parents to address student needs, offer college and career assistance, and connect students and parents with community resources.

We offer the following Academic Counseling Services at Notre Dame Academy:

Academic Enhancement Program

NDA offers courses to assist students with academic needs in the freshman through senior years. These courses are taught by an Intervention Specialist who works closely with the Counseling Staff to assist these students.

Educational Plans for Students with Diagnosed Learning Issues

NDA recognizes that many students have a diagnosed learning issue and will work with these students and their parents to set up an educational plan that will address any accommodations that can be made for the student, such as extended time for assessments or having a test read aloud. This plan is important to have in place for extended time allowances on standardized tests such as the SAT/PSAT and ACT. NDA requires an application for parents to complete and submit with evaluations prior to creating an educational plan.

The Bridge Program (for Incoming Freshmen)

Notre Dame hosts The Bridge Program each summer for incoming freshmen. The goal of this program is to provide incoming freshmen with a bridge from middle school to high school. It strengthens skills in the areas of Math, English and Study Skills. Besides the academic assistance, The Bridge Program is a great opportunity for students to get an early start on making new friends and finding their way around NDA. This program generally takes place the week before school starts and is from 9:30 a.m. - 12:00 noon. There is a fee to attend this program, but scholarships are available to those who need them.

Scheduling Meetings and Follow-up Assistance with Scheduling ties and receive a tentative freshman schedule. This occurs in the spring before the start of the freshman year.

Current freshmen, sophomore, and junior students along with their parents are invited to attend an informational grade level scheduling meeting in January at NDA. Prior to the meeting, students will meet during a long homeroom period to discuss course options. The various departments recommend students for specific courses and levels (College Prep, Honors, AP).

- Administration of Standardized Testing world of work. Here are the standardized tests that students will take at NDA.

Freshmen: CERT (College Equipped Readiness Test)/Practice ACT test (taken on the iPad)

Sophomores: Students take the PSAT (Practice SAT Test) and CERT (College Equipped Readiness Test)/Practice ACT (taken on the iPad)

Juniors: Students take the PSAT/NMSQT (National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test). NDA Juniors also take an official ACT Test during a school day in the spring. Students can send the Composite Score from this test to colleges/military/etc. It is an official test. Students will register for this special ACT Test during school with NDA's Counselors. Students do not register online for this test. They will also take a full-length practice ACT prior to the in-school test.

Life Skill Lessons

Various topics are explored with students to improve their soft skill competencies.

College Workshops

College Workshops are offered to all rising seniors several weeks before the start of school. Each senior is given valuable information about the college application process.

Student Records

NDA's Student Services/Records Coordinator organizes student transcripts and standardized test scores and aids students in the college application process.

Incoming freshmen and their parents are invited to small group meetings to discuss curriculum and co-curricular opportuni-

We strive to assist students and families with every step of navigating the college admissions process. Our counselors serve

NDA's Counselors offer each student at Notre Dame Academy support and resources that will prepare her to reach her future goals. A NOTRE DAME ACADEMY EDUCATION

SCHEDULE UTILIZED: Notre Dame Academy runs on a semester system and there are seven, 45 minute classes each day. All 1.0 credit classes meet the entire year. The 1/2 credit classes are either one-semester in duration or meet 3 days a week the entire year.

PANDA PRIME TIME: Panda Prime Time (PPT) is a flexible time period in the school day that offers students many opportunities for enrichment, support, collaboration and personal learning. The added period is a prime time for students to learn how to balance and organize time leading them to success in college and beyond. Some students may be required to meet with a teacher during this time and failure to meet this obligation will result in disciplinary consequences. Students are expected to utilize the school's facilities as outlined by administration.

SCIENCE RESEARCH: Science Research is a ½ credit elective that takes place outside of school hours. Students conduct independent science research projects and present at regional, national and international competitions. Students must log a total of 144 hours of work per year.

WORK-STUDY PROGRAM: Notre Dame Academy's Work-Study Program makes it possible for families to receive financial assistance to subsidize their tuition. Eligible families are assigned jobs to assist in the cleaning of our facilities. Participation in work-study can reduce a student's tuition significantly. Currently, 1 out of 4 NDA families participates in the Work Study Program.

The Admissions Process

Our admissions process gives prospective students and their families the opportunity to learn about our school and allows us to get to know each applicant. The procedure for applying to Notre Dame Academy includes the following steps:

1. Request Information

Prospective students interested in learning more about Notre Dame Academy should complete the Join our Contact List form via our website, https://www.ndapandas.org/admissions/ExperienceNDA24-25. They can also contact our Enrollment Office directly to receive correspondence from NDA.

2. NDA Visit

Prospective students can experience daily life at NDA by scheduling a half-day shadow visit. Prospective students and their parents can learn about academics, admission policies, and student life by attending an Information Session on either October 3 or 22 or by attending our Open House on November 10 from 1:00 -3:00 p.m.

3. Take the High School Placement Test (HSPT)

All incoming freshman students interested in attending Notre Dame Academy must take the High School Placement Test. The Diocesan-wide testing date for the HSPT is Saturday, December 14, 2024. Information regarding the HSPT will be mailed to prospective NDA students in November. There is a fee of \$20.00 that must be paid at the time of test registration. The deadline for registration is Tuesday, December 10, 2024.

This test is used for admission and academic placement for the student. Recommendations from elementary school teachers are also considered.

If the test is taken at another location the results can be sent to Notre Dame Academy; however, PRIORITY FOR SCHOL-ARSHIPS WILL BE GIVEN TO STUDENTS WHO TAKE THE HSPT AT NOTRE DAME ACADEMY. If the test has not been taken, contact NDA at 859-292-1829.

4. Receive HSPT Scores

Our HSPT Results Meeting for parents and students will be on Monday, January 13, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at Notre Dame Academy. Students who are eligible for academic scholarships based on their HSPT scores will be notified of their eligibility prior to this meeting.

5. Submit Online Application and Registration Fee

The NDA Freshman Priority Application period is from January 13, 2025 – February 7, 2025. All registration materials and a non-refundable \$200 registration fee must be submitted to Notre Dame Academy by February 7, 2024, to be eligible for scholarship consideration and our drawing for two \$500 tuition vouchers.

Once you have completed the Online Application for Admission and paid your registration fee, your application is complete and you will be assigned an NDA student ID number and an application number.* Following the completion of your application, you will receive an admission confirmation letter along with our Freshman Course Offering Request Form. This form must be completed and returned to the NDA Enrollment Office before your freshman class schedule can be finalized.

*It is important to note that the application number is a sequential number based on the date and time of the completion of the application. This number will be used in the course assignment process for classes that are assigned on a "first come, first served" basis.

6. Freshman Conference

The admission confirmation letter will contain instructions for scheduling an appointment for a freshman conference on either March 8 or March 22, 2025. Conferences are held with new students, their parents and members of our Academic Counseling and Student Support Services staff. Students will get an overview of the freshman curriculum and will have the opportunity to talk one-on-one with our counselors about their individual class schedules. Schoolbelles will also be available to take orders for uniforms and our spirit shop will be open.

Notre Dame Academy is committed to working with any family whose daughter could benefit from a Notre Dame education. NDA intends to strengthen its efforts to engage stakeholders to support its mission. Tuition and expense increases will be kept to a minimum without sacrificing quality.

Tuition Assistance/Scholarships

Grants and Scholarships - Over 62 need-based grants are available to students through the generosity of several benefactors. These grants range from \$500 to \$4000. Applications are available on the NDA website.

Sr. Agnetis Scholarship - Students ranking first and second in their class, and two others, voted upon by the faculty, are awarded this scholarship. These students are chosen because of their overall attitude toward learning and their academic achievement.

Incoming Freshmen Scholarships - NDA students scoring high on the placement test are eligible for a scholarship. Several one-time scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$2,500 are awarded to the top performers registered for NDA.

Academic Excellence Scholarships - The following scholarships are awarded to students scoring in the top percentiles on the placement test. Each scholarship is renewable if the student's grade-point average is maintained.

Work/Study Program - In addition to the grants and scholarships, it is possible to participate in the Work/Study program by which families work to pay off tuition costs.

In order to be eligible for Financial Assistance and/or the Work/Study Program at Notre Dame Academy, one must follow a two-step process:

English

The English Department aims to provide students with the opportunity to master the writing, reading, speaking, listening, and thinking skills they need for an adult life in our society. It hopes to awaken or intensify a love for reading and to encourage analytic and creative writing ability. It strives to help students learn to evaluate the communications media so that they maintain values consistent with their Christian beliefs. The English Department also aims to provide learning situations and experiences which promote cultural development rooted in the knowledge and experience of literature, music, art, and history.

Arts

The Arts Department of Notre Dame Academy seeks to instill the wonder and beauty of creative expression in all of our students. Whether it is vocal or instrumental music, studio art and design, hand sewn quilts or theater productions, we believe that the arts enrich human life and explore the potential inside each one of us. Students are required to take 1 credit in the Arts and may take additional courses as electives. Many of the courses are complemented by performance opportunities.

Religion

The Religion Department of Notre Dame Academy assists young women in the development of their faith and in forming small Christian communities beginning in their freshman year. Students are encouraged to view faith as a gift from God that must be nourished and lived out according to the Gospel values inherent in the Catholic Tradition. Not only are students taught Catholic doctrine and the eternal truth found in Sacred Scripture and Tradition, but also they are encouraged to use critical thinking skills regarding their spiritual development and the formation of a moral conscience. A positive relationship with God and with others is accomplished through opportunities for involvement in their school, community and the world, through service opportunities for those in need, provided by Campus Ministry.

Notre Dame Academy has a long tradition of success in STEM related areas. NDA continues to bring innovation in education to its students, providing many opportunities for students to build the confidence and skills needed to pursue STEM careers. With a focus on becoming effective in the 21st century, NDA students must be able to create, evaluate, and effectively utilize information, media and technology. In this globally competitive information age, teaching students the skills to navigate complex work and life environments is critical to their success.

Science

Science is a major part of modern day culture. It is important not only in its factual content, but also in its method and philosophy. Since it has become enmeshed in social institutions, NDA students need to be scientifically literate, develop a sense of inquiry. and be appreciative of the natural world. At NDA, students learn to use the scientific method to develop careful observation, critical thinking, and problem solving skills in biology, chemistry, physics and physical science. Students also have tremendous opportunities to pursue research opportunities at NDA.

Technology

Notre Dame Academy's technology and business courses are designed to prepare students to develop various technology related skills as lifelong learners. The use of technology has become increasingly integrated into the curriculum at NDA and students have many opportunities to use what they learn in the technology program in other classes. As part of the program, students study the moral and ethical choices facing our society in the proper and safe use of technology at home, school and when working in the business world.

Engineering

NDA students are introduced to various fields of engineering, the engineering design process, and core math and science concepts that encompass all fields of engineering. Students examine ethics in engineering, teamwork, and the technical communication necessary for successful engineering practices.

Mathematics

Math is a tool used to develop logical and creative thinking. The mathematics curriculum at Notre Dame Academy is designed to achieve a proper balance between theory and application through practice and problem solving. The curriculum continues to evolve with the advancements in technology. The mathematics department offers courses that utilize a variety of teaching methods to develop each student's mathematical potential.

World Languages

The study of world languages helps the student acquire a knowledge and appreciation of other people, their manner of communication, and their culture. As our world shrinks through telecommunication advancements and society becomes more mobile, the appreciation of other languages and cultures becomes a necessary social tool. Furthermore, the study of other cultures becomes a stepping-stone to broader global awareness. In addition, the study of languages facilitates probable and accessible international travel, both for business and pleasure.

Freshman Course Offerings

Because students enter Notre Dame Academy from many different grade schools, each with their own unique academic programs, placement in freshman classes is made based on a number of factors. These include: entrance test scores, other standardized tests taken during grade school, recommendations made by the student's grade school teachers, and interviews with the student and her parent/guardian(s). Students placed in the Algebra 2-Honors, Algebra 1-Honors or Language 2-Honors classes must have department approval and pass a qualifying test given in the spring prior to beginning their freshman year in the fall. Students who complete the NDA/CCH Algebra 1 Grade 8-Honors course with a minimum grade of 82 may enroll in Algebra 2-Honors as freshmen.

High School Placement Test (HSPT)

All incoming freshmen are required to take the test.

You can register for the HSPT with this QR code beginning on November 4.

The registration deadline for the HSPT is December 10, 2024.

The HSPT is one tool used to determine a student's level of preparation for high school and the appropriate placement for her in freshman courses. We also consult the grade schools to assist in this process. Our goal is to achieve the best placement to challenge and support each student's academic experience at NDA.

Students do not need to bring any testing materials for the HSPT, as we will supply everything they need. Please note that calculators may not be used for the HSPT. Students may bring a small snack and a drink in a closed container to eat during their break.

Students with diagnosed learning disabilities who qualify for extended testing time should contact the NDA Admissions Office at 859-292-1829 to arrange for the extended time.

On the day of the test, students should arrive at 8:45 a.m. Parents are invited to walk in with their daughter to check in for the test and then students will be directed to a classroom.

If the test is taken at another location the results can be sent to Notre Dame Academy. If a prospective student has not taken the test but is interested in attending NDA, contact the Admissions Office at (859) 292-1829.

Please note: Priority for freshman academic scholarships will be given to students who take the HSPT at Notre Dame Academy.
