#### Dear NDA Families.

I want to share an important leadership update at Notre Dame Academy. Mr. Jack VonHandorf will step down as principal at the end of this school year after a decade of dedicated service. His leadership and commitment to NDA have been invaluable, and we are deeply grateful for his dedication to our students, faculty, and mission. While we will greatly miss him, we extend our sincere appreciation for his service and wish him every success in his next chapter.

Jack's time at NDA has been marked by significant accomplishments. Under his leadership, NDA introduced initiatives such as Panda Prime Time and the Family System, earned accreditation from the Southern Association of Secondary Schools/Cognia, and was recognized as a National Blue Ribbon School of Excellence. Most importantly, before he leaves, the beloved "Mr. V" will have led ten graduating classes of young women who are now making a difference in the world. We have known that this would be Jack's final year at NDA since last spring, when he made the generous decision to stay for one more year to provide stability after an unexpected leadership transition. As I stepped into the role of interim president, I asked Jack to continue in his role for an additional year, and without hesitation, he rescinded his resignation to ensure continuity and a strong foundation for NDA's future. His willingness to put NDA first during a crucial time speaks volumes about his dedication to our school and its mission.

As we look ahead, I want to assure you that NDA remains steadfast in its commitment to stability and excellence. Leadership transitions are a natural part of any institution's growth, and we are fully prepared to navigate this process with care and purpose. Given that NDA is also conducting a presidential search, our Board of Directors is working diligently to bring that process to a close soon, and we anticipate sharing an announcement in the near future.

To ensure a smooth transition, I have committed to our Board of Directors to remain in the role of interim president through June 30, providing necessary stability during this time. Our entire NDA community will continue working together to foster continuity next school year as we ideally welcome both a new president and principal. With NDA's strong foundation, rooted in the legacy of the Sisters of Notre Dame, we will move forward with confidence and purpose.

The search for NDA's next principal will get underway this week. I am working with the Board of Directors to establish a selection committee that will review applications and conduct interviews to ensure a thoughtful and thorough selection process. The ideal candidate will uphold the values of NDA, advance our mission, and guide our students to success. Our goal is to have NDA's next principal in place by July 1, 2025, ensuring a seamless transition in leadership.

While change can bring uncertainty, I have full confidence in the strength of our NDA community and our ability to grow and thrive through this transition. Like the Sisters of Notre Dame, we will continue to build upon the foundation of those who have come before us. As always, NDA remains committed to providing an exceptional educational experience for our students, ensuring their success in and beyond the classroom.

We are incredibly grateful for Jack's leadership and the legacy he leaves behind. Please join me in thanking him for his service and dedication to NDA.



### PUTTING LANGUAGE INTO LIFE

It's the greatest feeling when one can use a second language to help others. At that point, language study becomes academic as well as compassionate.

New opportunities have opened up for Spanish students since January 31. On that day, four students assisted Fiesta NKY, a nonprofit agency in Florence, to pack groceries to give to Latino families. The advantage of these groceries is that there are beans, rice, and corn flour (maseca), food staples for most Latino populations. The four students, entirely enthusiastic, spoke Spanish with the other volunteers helping to pack and tried to put their thoughts into Spanish as they worked, packing over 140 cartons! This activity is monthly, so another group will be able to experience this service opportunity on February 28. How wonderful that these young ladies are willing to give up part of their Friday evening.

Another recurring service opportunity is helping the teacher who gives English classes to immigrants at the Kenton County Public Library. The teacher asked if some of our students could come each Monday evening and "distract" the children of her students so that the parents could learn more successfully. But it is not just play. Our students are reading to three Venezuelan children in Spanish and English, building with blocks, as well as entertaining them with library interactive materials. Our students enjoyed the service, and we have a month of volunteers ready!



### WELCOME GERMAN EXCHANGE STUDENTS NEXT FALL!



### STUDENTS TAKE ACTION TO ADDRESS HEALTHCARE DISPARITIES

The Global Health Advocates Club at Notre Dame Academy is making a dif-ference! Led by juniors Liv Wallace and Addison Wuellner, the club recently hosted its first vaccine clinic in partnership with Grant County Drugs and the Nurse Advocacy Center for the Underserved (NACU). Nurse Lynn Brown shared her expertise with students, offering an eye-opening perspective on the chal-lenges many individuals face in accessing medical care.

Liv and Addison worked tirelessly to promote these events, creating informational flyers, spreading the word to the local community, and assisting nurses on-site.

### UNIQUE DESIGNS USING POSITIVE AND NEGATIVE SPACE

Art 1 is currently working on block prints. They start by designing a design using positive and negative space. They then transfer the sketch using granite to their cork blocks. They use a gouging tool to take out the cork material in the negative space areas of their designs. We then use brayers to ink their blocks before using a team of three to operate our printing press. They are then placed on the drying rack, they will be numbered signed and titled. The result will be 8 prints, 4 exactly the same and 4 unique to the artist hand.











### ART 2 EXPLORES CREATIVITY WITH IIM DINE-INSPIRED WORKS

Art 2 is currently working g on local artist Jim Dine inspired artworks. Each day they add a new medium to their drawing of a tool or painting of a symbol that represents them. They sketched out their composition, applied it the either paper or canvas. Starting with graphite on both and alternating between projects halfway through each class. These works evolve each day and they document their progress with an image we will eventually turn into a slideshow. This will show the evolution of their ideas. They are working in layering and freeing them from the constants of perfection. This is allowing for play, experimentation and amazing results!


#### Basketball -
