
At NDA, our traditions are more than just events—they are moments that strengthen our bonds as a community and remind us of the legacy of the Sisters of Notre Dame.

DISMISSAL CHANGES MARCH 27 AND MARCH 28

On March 27 and March 28, our teachers will be engaged in some important professional development. They will continue working on the curriculum work that has been an ongoing collaborative and powerful process so far. They are dedicated to enriching and enhancing the curriculum at NDA through this process. The students will follow a shortened schedule to allow for this time.

On March 27, the students will go to half of their classes, have a normal lunch, and then participate in two separate sessions. In one session they will listen to a presentation regarding grit and evaluate their own level of grit. In another session, they will hear from the Department of Homeland Security through a program called Know 2 Protect - an online safety program for teens. This presentation will address protecting personal information, setting up privacy settings, characteristics of online predators, sexting and permanency of online data, among other topics. On March 28, students will go to the remaining half of their classes and then do the following:
