NOTE: Financial assistance requests increase each year. We cannot stress enough the importance of getting your application in early. Late applications run the risk of financial aid funding being exhausted

If a family receives financial assistance, a family member is expected to also have a work study job. The application for work study jobs is available **HERE** and is due by April 15, 2025. Completed applications should be emailed to **workstudy@ndapandas.org**.

TAKE ACTION HELP SECURE FUNDING FOR SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS IN NONPUBLIC SCHOOLS

Since early February, Officer Ted Edgington, CCH's SRO and Mrs. Krendra McGuire, Superintendent for the Diocese of Covington, have been working tirelessly with the state government to ensure nonpublic schools are included in legislation providing up to \$20,000 in funding for School Resource Officers' salaries.

Thanks to their efforts and collaboration with other schools across the Commonwealth, House Bill 622 has successfully passed through both chambers of the Kentucky General Assembly. The final step in this process is the Governor's signature.

Now, we need your help.!

Please join us in urging Governor Andy Beshear to sign HB622 into law. This bill would offer essential support to fund the presence of School Resource Officers in nonpublic schools like NDA, helping ensure a safe environment for all students.

This is especially relevant to our NDA parents as NDA will welcome a School Resource Officer to our campus beginning in May. The cost of this will be covered in fees for next school year. If signed into law, HB622 would help offset that cost, easing the financial burden on our families while ensuring our campus remains safe and protected.




BRINGING BOLD DESIGNS TO LIFE NDA ARTISTS EXPLORE POP ART THROUGH SCREEN PRINTING

After exploring the colorful world of Andy Warhol and the Pop art movement, students at Notre Dame Academy have been diving into the creative process of screen printing—a hands-on art technique used by professional artists around the globe.

Under the guidance of art teacher Hunter Fleury an inspired by Warhol's bold use of color and repetition, students began by designing their own artwork using Procreate. From there, they transferred their digital designs onto mesh screens to prepare for printing. In screen printing, ink is pushed through a stencil-like screen using a tool called a squeegee. Each color in a design requires its own screen, so students learned the importance of careful planning and precision.

For this project, students are creating eight prints of their artwork, including one printed on a t-shirt. This multi-step process involves drying each ink layer before applying the next, helping to keep the colors crisp and clean. Students must think critically about how colors interact and take care to apply ink evenly for professional-looking results.

In the end, each student will have a vibrant collection of prints that showcase their creativity and technical skills—perfect for portfolio pieces or meaningful gifts. This project offers a valuable opportunity to explore texture, layering, and design while learning an art form used in studios and galleries around the world.
