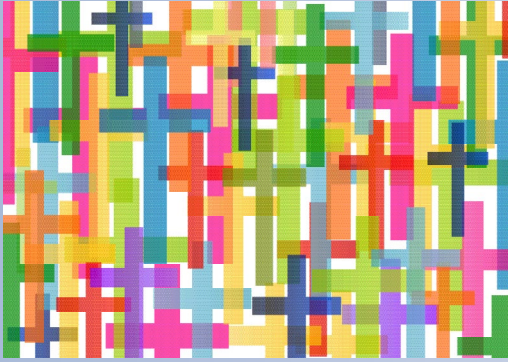

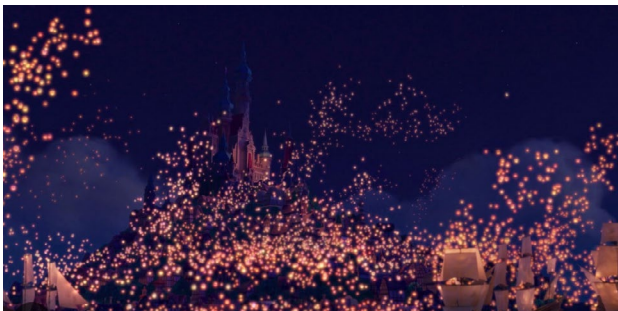

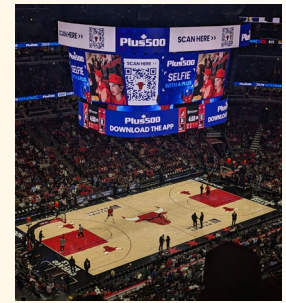

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

## HB622 VETOED BY GOVERNOR BESHEAR

Since early February, Officer Ted Edgington, CCH's School Resource Officer, and Mrs. Krendra McGuire, Superintendent for the Diocese of Covington, have worked tirelessly with state leaders to ensure non-public schools were included in House Bill 622. This legislation would have provided up to \$20,000 in funding—allocated to local police departments—to help offset the cost of placing School Resource Officers (SROs) in nonpublic schools like NDA.

Thanks to their determined efforts, the bill passed both chambers of the Kentucky General Assembly. Unfortunately, Governor Andy Beshear line-item vetoed the SRO funding portion of the bill last week. According to the Governor's letter, the veto was based on concerns about equitable funding allocation and budget priorities.

This is especially disappointing for our NDA community. Beginning in May, NDA will welcome a School Resource Officer to campus. While this is a critical step in enhancing the safety of our students, the associated cost will be covered by school fees next year. The passage of HB622 would have helped ease that financial burden on families.

As Superintendent McGuire stated in her letter to diocesan principals, "This is a matter of public safety. Every parent in this state pays taxes to support the safety of all citizens, including children in nonpublic schools."

We urge our NDA families to take action. Please consider sending a respectful letter to the Governor, expressing your disappointment in his decision and encouraging future support for protecting all students in Kentucky—regardless of the type of school they attend.

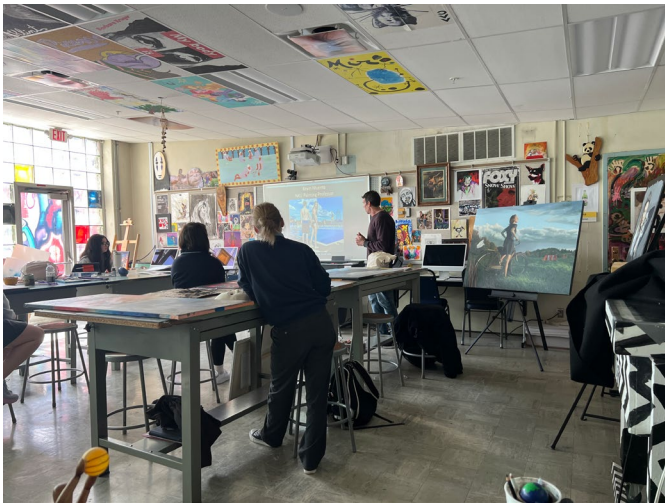

### Lacrosse -

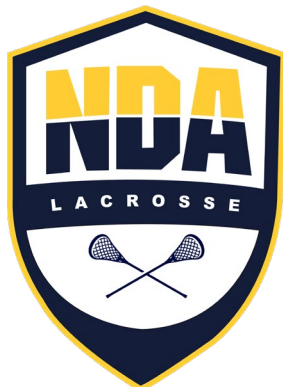

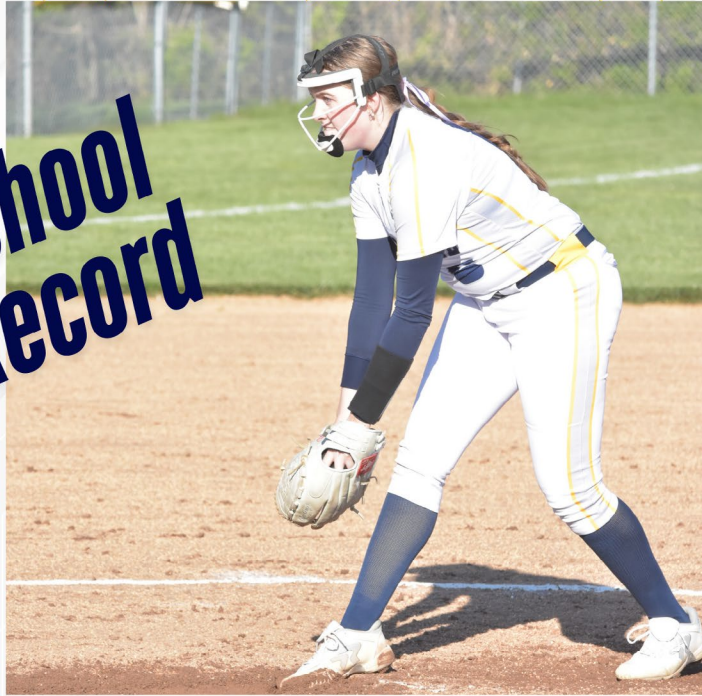

## SENIOR PITCHER SETS NEW ALL-TIME RECORD WITH 588 CAREER STRIKEOUTS ABBY TURNPAUGH BREAKS STRIKEOUT RECORD IN DOMINANT WIN OVER MCNICHOLAS

Abby Turnpaugh delivered a record-setting performance Tuesday night, leading the Notre Dame Academy Pandas to a 4-1 extra-inning win over Archbishop McNicholas. With 17 strikeouts in the game, Turnpaugh not only secured the victory but also etched her name into the history books as Notre Dame Academy's all-time strikeout leader with 588 career strikeouts.

Turnpaugh was unstoppable in the circle, allowing just two hits and one run across eight innings while issuing no walks. Her leadership, poise and competitive spirit helped the Pandas hold off the Rockets in a game that highlighted her remarkable consistency and skill.

Head Coach Chris Roesel said plans are underway to recognize Turnpaugh's historic accomplishment with a special presentation at an upcoming home game, including the game ball and a commemorative plaque.

Abby's achievement is a testament to her hard work, resilience and commitment to her team. Her legacy will inspire future Pandas for years to come.
