

## **Dear Parents,**

This is our final newsletter of the school year. I appreciate you taking the time to read the information that has been presented each week. Communication is a very important component of our partnership in your daughter's education.

I am grateful to our faculty, staff, students and parents for all they have done to make the 2023-24 school year such a success. I am amazed how willing you, our parents, are to help and contribute to NDA. Your generosity of time, talent and treasure is often reflected by the actions of your daughters.

I would like to congratulate our Class of 2024. As a class, they earned over \$18 million dollars in scholarships. An incredible 25% of them received offers of half tuition or more to the school they are attending in the fall. Please remember that we are taking a different approach to summer reading this year. Instead of assigning specific summer reading for our students, we will encourage them to choose books that genuinely interest them to read over the summer. We believe that allowing students to select their own reading material will foster a deeper love for reading and provide them with the opportunity to explore genres and topics that better resonate with their personal interests. We highly encourage parents to discuss their daughter's summer reading selections with them and even read the books together.

While there will not be a general "summer reading" list provided by NDA's English Department this summer, some classes may still require specific summer reading assignments. Please know that any required reading will be communicated directly to students by their respective teachers. We will continue our tradition of a common reader because we understand the value of a shared literary experience. Rather than reading this book over the summer however, students will read the common reader selection when they return to school in August. Unlike in years past, assignments and curriculum will be designed around the common reader to facilitate meaningful discussions and analysis in the classroom. We hope through this new approach to summer reading, students will find reading during their break more enjoyable!

We have had an amazing school year at NDA *Radiating God's Goodness*! As we begin our summer break, we give thanks for the many ways in which God's Goodness and Provident Care have blessed our school this year. It is clear to me, and I hope to each of you, that at NDA, we are part of a tradition larger than any one of us, a strong academic tradition of empowering young women to make a difference in the world. Thank you for partnering with us in your daughter's Catholic education. I look forward to seeing our students in August and I wish you and your family a blessed and safe summer.

## UNIFORMS FOR THE 2024-25 SCHOOL YEAR

Dear Parents,

As we discussed back in March, we really focused on a few key elements of our uniform during the 2023-24 school year. This included things like wearing the lanyard, a collared shirt, wearing tapered leggings instead of sweatpants and appropriate shoes. We worked hard to make sure all our students understood these guidelines and addressed uniform issues as they surfaced.

Looking ahead to the 2024-25 school year, I want to reassure you that we'll continue to enforce all aspects of our dress code, including skirt lengths. Our goal is to ensure that every student represents Notre Dame Academy in the best possible way – respectful, traditional and proud. Our handbook lays out the importance of our dress code, not just for appearance's sake, but also to promote cleanliness, respect for oneself and others, and to create a conducive learning environment for everyone.

Our uniform policy has been a cornerstone of Notre Dame Academy for over a century, instilling a sense of pride and belonging in our students. When they put on their NDA gray skirt, it's more than just following rules – it's about embracing our school's mission with pride. We're proud of our uniform because it reflects the values and mission of NDA and we want our students to feel that pride too.

Before the school year starts, we'd really appreciate it if you could go over the uniform guidelines (found below) with your daughter and ensure she's comfortable and compliant.

Thank you so much for your ongoing support in maintaining our uniform standards. Together, we're creating an environment where our students can shine both academically and personally.

#### Approved Uniform pieces are listed below as stated in our Student/Parent Handbook:

Notre Dame Academy has a school uniform that consists of:

- a gray uniform skirt or uniform slacks (the skirt or pants must be the proper size and length, be zipped and buttoned, hemmed appropriately and free of stains, rips, and/or holes). Students are required to obtain a new skirt or pants if it no longer zips, has tears, holes, or stains. Please note: Skirt should extend below student's fingertips when arms are fully extended at one's side.
- · a white or light blue banded Notre Dame Academy polo shirt
- solid white, gray, black or navy blue socks
- appropriate shoes that have a back to them
- · name tag/lanyard

Optional items that may be purchased and worn with the uniform include:

- a navy blue Notre Dame Academy pullover sweater
- · a navy blue Notre Dame Academy cardigan sweater
- a navy blue Notre Dame Academy sweater vest
- · a navy blue Notre Dame Academy sweatshirt (available for purchase through Schoolbelles and NDA's Bambootique)
- · a navy blue Notre Dame Academy fleece
- · a navy blue blazer with NDA's emblem for special occasions such as Mass, award ceremonies, etc.
- · gray, black, or navy blue leggings that are close fitting and tapered at the ankle
- black dress slacks for designated events

#### **SOFTBALL**


Softball Pandas advance to the Regional finals in walk off fashion winning 4-3 in the bottom of the 7th.

#### **TENNIS**




