HANDS-ON LEARNING EXPLORING NETWORK STRUCTURES

In class today, Ms. Dooling's AP Computer Science students worked in groups to create computer networks using strings to represent connections between devices. Through hands-on challenges, they explored how different network structures impacted communication, navigating guidelines and making decisions on the best ways to connect. The unplugged activity helped students understand key concepts such as bandwidth, computing devices, and the flow of data within a network. By the end of the lesson, students identified paths between devices and justified their networking choices, setting the stage for deeper discussions on the societal and economic impacts of computer networks.

***The Band will be performing its halftime show with the dance pandas at various CCH Football and NDA Sporting Events. See you there!




SHADOW DAY ST. JOSEPH'S 8TH GRADERS EXPERIENCE NDA LIFE

SUPPORT SCHOOL CHOICE VOTE YES ON AMENDMENT 2 THIS NOVEMBER


There will be an important piece of legislation on the ballot in November supported by the Bishops of Kentucky, a state constitutional amendment – Vote YES on Amendment 2.
