NATIONAL MERIT SEMIFINALISTS

We are thrilled to announce that three of our amazing NDA seniors, Anna Blair, Emma White and Chanduni Herath, have been named National Merit Semifinalists! This prestigious honor recognizes their exceptional academic achievements, dedication, and hard work.

The National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC) has announced the names of more than 16,000 Semifinalists in the 2025 National Merit® Scholarship Program. These academically talented high school seniors have the opportunity to compete for one of 6,870 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$26 million, which will be offered next spring. Semifinalists must advance to Finalist standing by fulfilling additional requirements, and about 95% are expected to become Finalists. Of those, about half will win a National Merit Scholarship and earn the Merit Scholar® title.

Time: 8:00-10:30 p.m. (Arrive by 8:30, and no one leaves before 10:00)


Place: Upper level of The Gardens next to CCH



NOTRE DAME ACADEMY & THOMAS MORE UNIVERSITY LAUNCH HISTORIC DIRECT COLLEGE ADMISSION PARTNERSHIP

Notre Dame Academy is thrilled to announce a ground breaking partnership with Thomas More University, offering direct admission for NDA graduates starting with the Class of 2025. This innovative agreement, signed on September 12, 2024, will provide a streamlined path for NDA students to continue their education at Thomas More, the Catholic university of the Diocese of Covington. The NDA Class of 2025 will be the first to benefit from this program, which guarantees a seamless transition into higher education for eligible students.

The partnership between Notre Dame Academy and Thomas More University reflects the long-standing relationship between the two institutions, both rooted in Catholic values and dedicated to empowering young women. NDA, founded in 1906 by the Sisters of Notre Dame, has been a beacon of academic excellence for women in the Diocese of Covington. Similarly, Thomas More University, established in 1921 to provide higher education for women and Catholic school teachers, continues to lead in faith-based education.

"This partnership allows us to extend the mission of Notre Dame Academy and provide a seamless transition for our graduates into a university that shares our values of academic excellence, service, and faith," said Jane Kleier, Interim President and Chief Communications Officer of Notre Dame Academy. "We are proud to collaborate with Thomas More University to offer this opportunity to our students, and we are confident it will further prepare them to make a positive impact in the world."

To qualify for the direct admission program, NDA students must meet academic and disciplinary requirements, release their transcripts to Thomas More at the end of their junior year, and opt into the program by completing a short online profile. This initiative eliminates the stress of the traditional college application process, offering students a clear path to further their education in a supportive, Catholic environment.

"This partnership strengthens the bonds between our two historic institutions, while honoring our shared legacy and the values of a Catholic, faith-based education. This announcement today expands the work of Thomas More University to reduce barriers and increase access to Catholic higher education," says Thomas More University President Joseph L. Chillo, L.PD.

In addition to guaranteed admission, NDA students will benefit from professional development opportunities for their teachers and staff through Thomas More University. Thomas More's School of Education will offer annual professional development sessions, reinforcing the commitment to academic rigor and excellence shared by both institutions.

This historic program is the first of its kind between an all-girls Catholic high school and a university in the Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky area. It further strengthens the relationship between NDA and Thomas More, offering students and their families new opportunities for academic and personal growth. Through this collaboration, NDA and Thomas More will continue to empower future generations of leaders who are grounded in faith, service, and academic excellence.






