

NOTRE DAME ACADEMY KICKS OFF STRATEGIC PLANNING PROCESS

Notre Dame Academy officially launched its five-year Strategic Planning process last night, bringing together leadership, faculty, staff and Board members to chart the future direction of the school. The initiative, *Rooted in Faith, Leading with Vision*, reflects NDA's commitment to advancing its mission of educating young women to make a difference in the world while building on its rich legacy.

Led by Interim President/CCO Jane Kleier and facilitated by Mary Claire Kasunic from Partners in Mission, the Strategic Planning process will focus on eight key areas: Academics and Technology, Advancement, Catholic Identity, Enrollment, Facilities, Finances, Governance and Student Life. Each area will be thoroughly assessed by Domain Chairs and Staff Liaisons, gathering input from students, parents, faculty, alumnae and other stakeholders.

The goal of the Strategic Plan is to create a forward-thinking vision that ensures NDA thrives in the evolving landscape of Catholic education. Surveys have already been completed with strong participation, providing valuable insights to guide the process.

During the kickoff event, Domain Chairs received guidance on assessing each area using historical data and key information. The data gathered will be used to create narrative overviews for each domain, laying the foundation for NDA's future vision. A SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats) will also help identify key areas for growth.

This effort will culminate in a Strategic Planning Workshop in late February, where objectives will be drafted to guide NDA over the next five years, ensuring the school remains true to its Catholic mission while evolving as a leader in education.

Jessica Rawe, Chair of the NDA Board, and Betsy Weber, Chair of the Mission Integration Committee, expressed gratitude for the NDA community's support. They emphasized the importance of input from all stakeholders in shaping a plan that addresses the school's future needs and continues to deliver an exceptional Catholic education.

The kickoff event took place on October 1, Foundation Day of the Sisters of Notre Dame, making it a particularly meaningful day to reflect on NDA's rich history and values. NDA invites the entire school community to stay engaged and help shape the future of the school through this collaborative process. Stay tuned for updates as the Strategic Plan progresses.

Time: 8:00-10:30 p.m. (Arrive by 8:30, and no one leaves before 10:00)


Place: Upper level of The Gardens next to CCH

tions, prizes, food, drinks, and a DJ!


Tickets are only \$5 (cash only) and must be purchased in advance. Mrs. Monohan will be selling tickets during lunches next week and at other times to be announced.


