## FACULTY AND STAFF EMBRACE THE SPIRIT OF SERVICE AT NDA

On Friday, October 11, the faculty and staff of Notre Dame Academy stepped outside the classroom to live the school's mission of service and community involvement. 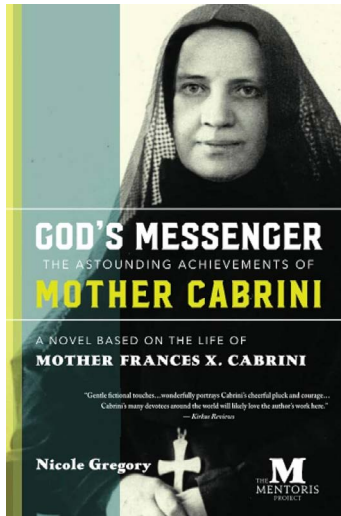

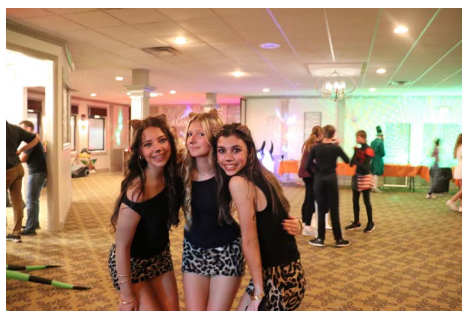
## SPOOKY FUN FRESHMAN HALLOWEEN DANCE

## TEACHING MEDIA LITERACY IN SCIENCE CLASSROOMS NDA EDUCATOR COAUTHORS ARTICLE IN NATIONAL BIOLOGY JOURNAL

Notre Dame Academy is proud to share that NDA's Assistant Principal for Academics and biology teacher Molly Proudfit recently coauthored an article published in *The American Biology Teacher*, the official journal of the National Association of Biology Teachers.

The article, titled *Managing Misinformation: An ABT-Based Teaching Guide*, provides a framework for teaching media literacy in science classrooms. It offers practical strategies for educators to help students navigate misinformation and aligns these approaches with the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). This insightful work highlights the importance of evaluating information credibility, understanding scientific consensus and fostering critical thinking in today's media landscape.

We are thrilled to see the contributions of NDA faculty showcased in such an influential publication. This achievement not only reflects Ms. Proudfit's dedication to education but also underscores NDA's commitment to academic excellence and leadership in education. 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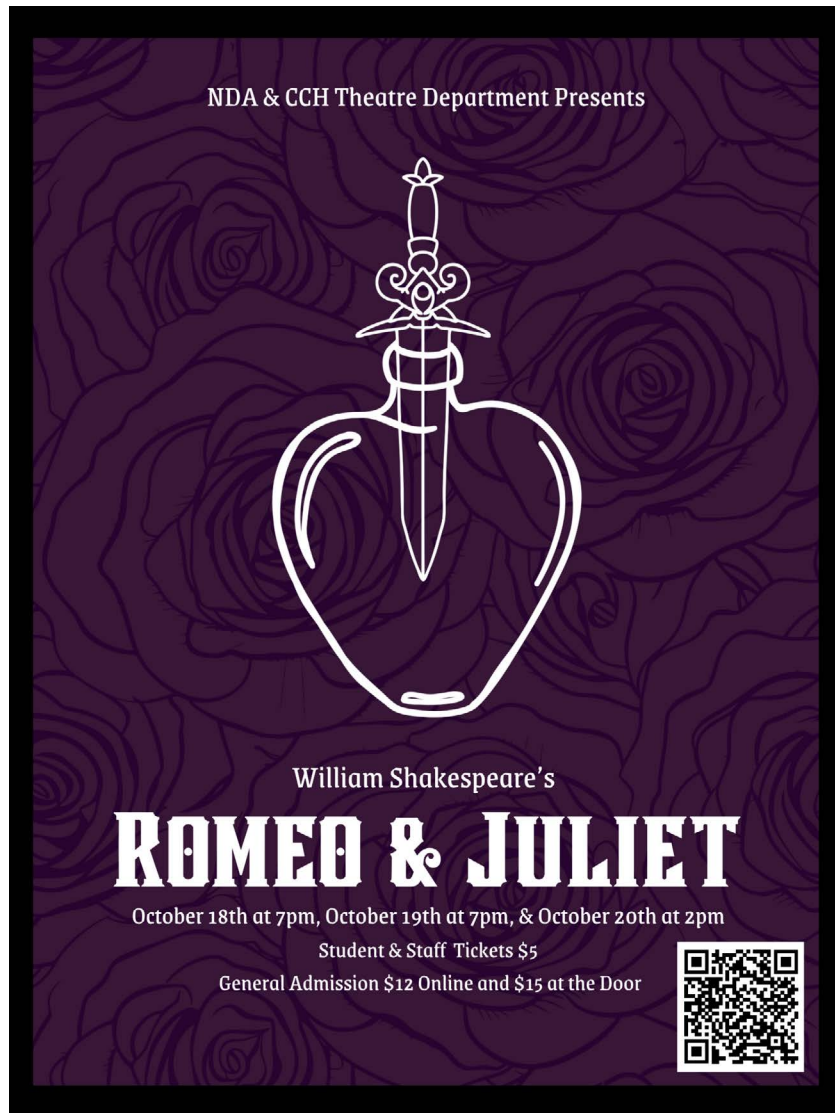

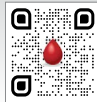

The team defeated Assumption at NDA in the St. Elizabeth Volleyball Game of the Month. They are celebrating their seniors against Conner tonight.

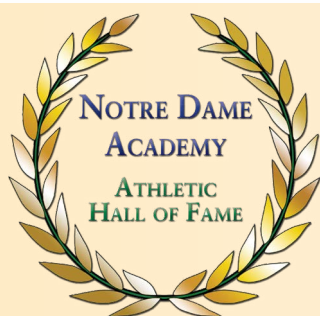
