There are so many exciting things happening at NDA this season! Be sure to read below for updates and opportunities to join us in celebrating the joy and spirit of Advent.



CAN THE CRU AND BEAT THE BREDS

NDA was able to successfully "Can the Cru," however we came up short in "Beating the Breds." NCC collected 33 items per person while we averaged about 29 items per person. St. Henry averaged 13 items per person. So, while the real victory is the fact that we collected 13,899 items for St. Vincent dePaul, we weren't the overall winner of the competition. We were able to crush our goal of collecting 10,000 items and also beat last year's total of 13,469 cans. Our family competition was successful as well. The St. Rose of Lima Family (Pink Family) came in fourth place with 2,995 items. The St. Hildegard of Bingen Family (Purple Family) came in third place with 3,389 items. The St. Joan of Arc Family (Blue Family) earned the second place spot with 3,626 items. The winner of the 2024 Canned Food Drive is the St. Gemma Galgani Family (Green Family) with 3,889 items brought in.... Our Family Leaders will be tallying up the family competition totals this month to give us a breakdown as we reach the middle of the year.




HOST FAMILIES NEEDED
