Thank you for your continued support of Notre Dame Academy. May the joy and peace of Advent fill your hearts as we prepare for the celebration of Christ's birth.



RUN, HIDE, FIGHT CRITICAL THINKING EXERCISE IN SAFETY!

On Friday December 13, our students will engage in a critical thinking exercise centered around the Run, Hide, Fight protocols. The students will be given hypothetical scenarios and situations that could occur and impact the safety of our school. With groups, the girls will have to determine how to respond to these situations to uphold the safety of themselves and others. The Run, Hide, Fight protocol is similar to the ALICE protocol that students are most likely familiar with from grade school. Sadly, it is crucial that our girls are prepared for various situations and this activity is a great exercise in doing so.

Archery - hosted their annual archery tournament at Notre Dame to kick off the season. They placed 4th in their invite and had 6 in the top 15 with 7 archers shooting their personal best. The Pandas have already qualified for the post season with a team score of 3166. Congratulations to our Archery Pandas. Next up the team will take part in the Twenhofel tournament on Friday and Saturday.

Basketball - is off to a great start with a 3-0 start. They took down the Scott Eagles 74 - 51. Four pandas were in double figures, Emma Holrzapfel and Maya Lawrie had 16 points, Sophia Gibson added 13 and Amelia Stallard chipped in with 12. Next up on Tuesday, all three teams are playing Seton at Notre Dame, 4:30/6:00/7:30 p.m. and then Friday NDA takes on Dixie at Bellevue at 7:45 p.m.

Swimming and Diving - On Saturday, the AquaPandas competed in the St. Henry Winter Classic at Keating Natatorium (St. Xavier HS) and earned an impressive 2nd place finish out of 7 teams.Top individual performances included:

- Andi Carothers (Senior): 1st in the 200 Free, 3rd in the 100 Free
- Peyton Quinn (Junior): 2nd in the 100 Free
- Liv Wallace (Junior): 1st in both the 50 Free and 100 Breast

Relay victories:

- 200 Medley Relay: Wallace, Quinn, Elsie Hanks (Sophomore), and Carothers
- 400 Free Relay: Carothers, Quinn, Hanks, and Wallace

All 12 girls competing in the event contributed to the scoring, with each securing at least one top-16 finish.

Savannah Bien scored a 256.4 score to win the diving meet.

Next for Swim and Dive is the Scott Invitational this Saturday at Scott High School.


REGISTER TODAY WINTER PREVIEW DAY AT THOMAS MORE UNIVERSITY
